Learning Intentions

Literacy

Writing and Listening & Talking

We will be learning:

- about a range of strategies used in persuasive texts
- to apply learned techniques appropriately

Reading

We will be learning to:

- develop our knowledge of literal, inferential and evaluative questions
- use evidence from a variety of texts and short clips to justify/support our responses/opinions

Numeracy and Maths

We will be learning to:

- select the most appropriate strategies to solve a variety of types of calculations
- apply maths skills and knowledge to a range of real-life and imaginary situations (STEM & problem-solving)

Health and Wellbeing

Learning Context: Building Resilience – Expect the Unexpected

We will be learning:

- that change is a necessary part of life and that it can be positive and negative
- that we all react differently to change
- to show resilience and confidence when coping with change
- that it is OK to experience disappointment, difficulties and loss and that some things cannot get better or be fixed

Learning Context: Living and Growing

We will be learning:

- to recognise that how our bodies change can affect how we feel about ourselves and how we may behave
- to describe the physical and emotional changes during puberty, understand why they are taking place and the importance of personal hygiene
- that all forms of abuse are wrong, and I am developing the skills to keep myself safe and get help if I need it
