Term 3: April – June 2024

Literacy

Children will:

- Further develop their handwriting skills and continue to apply the cursive joins in written work.
- Continue to apply known spelling patterns and commonly used words to all written work.
- Create their own imaginative story containing interesting characters or settings using a folktale as a stimulus.
- Identify the structure of an imaginative story and apply this in their creative writing.
- Retell the main ideas of a local folktale in the correct order.
- Recognise need for speech marks in a piece of text.
- Use adjectives and adverbs purposefully in their writing.

Health and Wellbeing

Through the Building Resilience programme children will:

- Learn that change is a necessary part of life and that change can be positive and negative.
- Understand that looking after their mental health is just as important as looking after their physical health.

In PE children will:

• Develop skills and techniques to improve their level of performance and fitness.

<u>Context for Learning</u>— Folklore and <u>The Local Environment</u>

Children will:

Be able to describe and recreate the features of the local landscape and retell folktales from my local area.

In Primary 3/4, skills knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities including direct teaching, targeted group time and tailored learning areas in the classroom and outdoor environment.

Numeracy and Maths

Children will:

- Explain what a fraction is using concrete materials and pictorial representations.
- Learn appropriate mathematical vocabulary to describe fractions.
- Learn to use the correct notation for common fractions.
- Compare fractions and order them on a numberline.
- Be able to use money to pay for items and can work out how much change I should receive .
- Investigate how different combinations of coins and notes can be used to pay for goods or be given in change.

How you can help at home...

Continue to support your child with Reading Home Learning and encourage a variety of texts to be read.

- Reading will be set regularly.
- Tricky Words and timestables will be sent home when appropriate.
- P.E days will be Mondays and Thursdays.
- Use notes and coins in real life situations.
