Teaching and Learning Overview – P6K

In Primary 6 skills, knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities. These include direct teaching, group work and a variety of independent and cooperative learning activities and experiences.

Term 3: January – April 2023

Learning Intentions

Literacy - Reading

We will be learning:

- to make a personal response to a text we have read using evidence from the text to support our point of view
- to discuss and answer literal, inferential and vocabulary questions about a text

Writing

We will be:

- learning about imaginative writing features and creating texts of our own
- continuing to develop technical accuracy (spelling & grammar, including punctuation) and neat handwriting style

Talking & Listening:

We will be developing:

our listening skills, taking notes as we listen to or watch a text

French

We will be:

learning vocabulary for clothing

Numeracy and Maths

We will be:

- continuing to select the most appropriate strategies to solve a range of calculations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division)
- developing our knowledge of money, including digital payments, and how to manage a simple budget
- using the common units of measure, converting between related units of the metric system and carrying out calculations when solving problems
- learning to calculate the area of a rectangle or square by using multiplication skills. Use similar strategies to calculate the area of compound shapes and right angled triangles

Health and Wellbeing

Learning Context: Building Resilience – Get Active

We will be learning:

- that being active is good for my body and mind and that hobbies and interests I enjoy and make me feel good.
- that trying something new involves taking a risk.

Learning Context: Sexual Health & Relationships:

We will be learning:

about physical and emotional changes which happen during puberty

PE - Learning Context: Gymnastics (Ms Fairbairn) / Dance (Mrs Kershaw)

We will be:

- learning about different features of dance and applying these to create short sequences of our own
- developing our ability to give and receive constructive feedback
