Children will:

- Further develop their handwriting skills and continue to apply the cursive joins in written work.
- Apply known spelling patterns and commonly used words to all written work.
- Be able to identify and use the features of a non-fiction text.
- Learn note taking skills and use them to create nonfiction texts of their own.
- Develop their reading evaluation skills through nonfiction texts.
- Share personal stories orally and listen to the experiences of others.
- Continue to develop their reading fluency, comprehension and expression.

Health and Wellbeing

Through the Building Resilience programme children will:

- Understand how important it is to be kind and the difference it can make to ourselves and others.
- Learn that it is important to be kind to yourself.

In PE children will:

• Develop their passing, receiving, attacking and defending skills through the context of Netball.

Children will:
