Term 1

We have had a fantastic first term at school, filled with learning, creativity, and new experiences. From our youngest learners in ELC to our senior pupils in P7, everyone has embraced challenges, celebrated successes, and shown real enthusiasm for their learning. As a whole school, we are on our journey to embed the 5Cs – Creativity, Communication, Collaboration, Curiosity, and Critical Thinking – into everything we do, helping our pupils develop skills for learning, life, and work. We are so proud of the progress made this term and look forward to even more exciting opportunities in Term 2!

School improvement

This term, our teachers have been working in groups to further enhance learning across the school: STEM, Outdoor Learning, and Pupil Voice. Staff training is being led by teachers and members of the SLT ensuring everyone has new skills and ideas to bring back to the classroom. Our first training session is centred around computing science. Staff will have the opportunity to explore a range of resources including blue bots and micro:bits. To increase Pupil voice, in the life and work of the school, pupils will have the opportunity to lead clubs such as sewing, reading, chess etc giving them a chance to take responsibility and share their skills with others. These activities also help pupils develop important skills for life, including Collaboration, Communication, Creativity, Critical Thinking, and Curiosity – the 5Cs

National Improvement for Writing

Three of our teachers are involved in the National Improvement for Writing in Scotland this term. They have been working with colleagues across the country to explore best practice and bring new ideas back to our classrooms to further support children's writing development. Our staff are using tools such as Pareto charts and run charts to carefully track pupil progress. These strategies engage children in their learning and allow them to see their progress. The strategies help teachers identify where children are doing well and where additional support may be needed, ensuring every child can continue to make strong progress in their learning.

Quality improvement

Learning Environment Walkthroughs

This term, the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) have carried out walkthroughs across the school to look at and celebrate the learning environments. The focus has been on:

- Class Charters linked to the UNCRC (United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child)
- Literacy and Numeracy walls to support learning
- Our school values, the 5Rs (Respected, Responsible, Resilient, Reflective, Receptive)
- Our 5Cs (Creativity, Communication, Critical Thinking, Curiosity, Collaboration)


These help ensure our classrooms are engaging, supportive, and consistent across the school;

Rights Respecting School

We are putting children's rights at the heart of our ethos and culture, to improve well-being and develop every child's talent and ability to their full potential. As part of this plan, we are working towards recognition as a Rights Respecting School, an award given to schools on behalf of UNICEF UK.

UNICEF UK works with schools to create safe and inspiring places to learn, where children are respected, their talents are nurtured and they are able to thrive. The Rights Respecting Schools Award supports schools to put in place a set of standards based on equality, dignity, respect, non-discrimination and participation. These values stem from the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC).

Lunches - ParentPay

Primary 1 to 5 pupils are entitled to a free school lunch. All lunches, free or paid, must be ordered through ParentPay. Please remember to order child's lunches in advance, preferably by the night before at the very latest, to ensure that your child receives the food you have chosen for them. Advance ordering limits time

spent on choosing meals during learning time in school. Meals can be ordered for an entire term if you wish.

What happens if I do not order a lunch?

If a lunch order has not been placed for your child, they will be offered a **soup and sandwich option**. Please note that we can only provide this choice, as all other meals are made to order in advance. Thank you for your understanding and support.

Nut Free School

Please remember that we are a nut-free school. We have a number of pupils, and staff, in school who are severely allergic to nuts. It is imperative these products are not brought to or consumed on school premises, including in the playground. Please check packaging especially cereal bars.

Snack Policy

- There will be one snack time, in class, during the school day free flow snack will no longer take place
- Class teachers will choose an appropriate time during the school day for the class to have snack
- Children should bring a healthy and nutritious snack
- Confectionary is not allowed confectionary includes sweets and chocolate. Children who bring confectionery will not be permitted to eat it
- We also do not permit grab bags of crisps.

We encourage children to bring water to school, in a named bottle. There are water dispensers in both buildings for children to re-fill throughout the day. Water bottles need to be cleaned daily; we will support children to take them home at the end of each day. **Please no juice as we are a health promoting** school and support good oral health.
