Literacy

Children will:

- Develop their knowledge of letter sounds.
- Learn to form patterns and letters in cursive script including writing their name.
- Tell stories through detailed drawings.
- Develop the skills required to be a good listener and share their responses confidently.

Health and Wellbeing

Children will:

- Understand the importance of rules and routines in class and school including how to keep ourselves and others safe.
- Through our Building Resilience program, develop an awareness that life is full of changes.
- Understand that our emotions can change as well and be able to express their emotions.

In PE,

- Learn to manage and control their movements, finding out how to use and share space.
- Improve their balance and coordination through ball skills.

Context for Learning

We will be reading a variety of stories by Julia Donaldson and developing our critical literacy skills through these stories e.g. rhyme awareness, story sequencing, character and setting.

In Primary 1, skills knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities including direct teaching, targeted group time and tailored learning areas in the classroom and outdoor environment.

Home Learning:

Phonics- Sound packs should be handed in on a **Friday** to collect new sounds. Please practise these sounds as often as possi-

Numeracy and Maths

Children will:

- Extend their knowledge, understanding and skills in number through practical activities and games that include recognising, ordering, counting and forming numbers.
- Investigate patterns and create their own using colours and shapes.
- Learn about the properties of 2D shapes.

How you can help at home...

- Practice sounds and blends provided regularly and support reading activities.
- Try to make CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant words e.g. cat, rat, wet etc). using the sound cards provided
- Encourage your child to be as independent as possible in dressing themselves and organising their belongings.
- Look at and try to name and describe 2D shapes in the environment.
- Read stories and discuss rhyming words, characters and setting. Try to predict what will happen next.
