In Primary 6 skills, knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities. These include direct teaching, group work and a variety of independent and cooperative learning activities and experiences.

Learning Intentions

Literacy - Reading

We will be learning:

- to make relevant comments about structure, characterisation and/or setting while listening to, watching or reading a text
- to relate the writer's theme to our own and/or others' experiences
- to respond to literal, inferential and evaluative guestions

Writing

We will be:

- learning about techniques used in poetry and applying them to create texts of our own
- developing our technical accuracy (spelling & grammar including punctuation)
- developing an efficient & legible handwriting style (cursive or printed)

Talking & Listening:

We will be developing:

• our listening skills, building up to multi-step instructions

French

We will be:

learning vocabulary for parts of the body

Numeracy and Maths

We will be learning to:

- select the most appropriate strategies to solve a range of calculations (addition, subtraction, multiplication, division)
- to find and classify types of angles and use angle knowledge to sort shapes
- to use subtraction skills to calculate missing angles in a shape
- to use knowledge of grid references and coordinates to draw shapes from given coordinates and translate (move) shapes up the y axis or along the x axis
