Literacy

Pupils will:

- Develop their knowledge of letter sounds, learning to identify the first sound of a word
- Begin to blend sounds to read 3 letter words
- Prepare to learn cursive handwriting by practising handwriting patterns
- Express ideas and thoughts through detailed drawings
- Discuss the who, what, and where in familiar stories
- Develop the skills required to be a good listener
- Gain confidence contributing ideas to class discussions

Health and Wellbeing

Pupils will:

- Understand the importance of rules and routines in class and school including how to keep ourselves and others safe
- Explore how positive thinking can help us with our feelings and wellbeing (through our Building Resilience Programme)

In PE, pupils will:

- Learn to manage and control their movements, exploring how to use and share space
- Develop hand eye co-ordination through a variety of activities and games

Context for Learning

We will be reading a variety of stories by Julia Donaldson to develop the

pupils' critical literacy skills e.g. rhyme awareness, story sequencing, character and setting.

In Primary 1, skills knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities including direct teaching, targeted group time and tailored learning areas in the classroom and outdoor environment.

Numeracy and Maths

Pupils will:

- Extend their knowledge, understanding and skills in number through practical activities and games that include recognising, ordering, counting and forming numbers
- Investigate patterns and create their own using colours and shapes
- Learn about the properties of 2D shapes

How you can help at home...

• Practise sounds provided regularly.

- Model how to read and make CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant words e.g. cat, rat, wet etc) using the sound cards provided.
- Practise hearing the first sound of words though games such as I spy.
- Encourage your child to be as independent as possible in dressing themselves and organising their belongings.
- Look out for and try to name and describe 2D shapes in the environment.
- Read stories and ask who, what, where and when questions to encouragement and deepen understanding of texts.
