Literacy

Through daily literacy activities, pupils will:

- continue to develop their handwriting skills and awareness of spelling/phonic patterns.
- continue to develop their understanding of grammar, sentence structure and more complex punctuation.
- continue to develop their reading and critical literacy skills within group reading sessions, comprehension tasks and through the use of P.E.E responses.
- describe and share personal experiences orally and through writing.
- continue to build up the content and detail within their writing by further developing their use of descriptive, figurative and emotive language.
- continue to review and correct their written work, ensuring it makes sense, is grammatically accurate and meets the criteria given.

Numeracy and Mathematics

Through daily numeracy and maths activities, pupils will:

- continue to develop a range of counting and calculation skills.
- develop their understanding of decimals, fractions and percentages.
- continue to focus on their quick and accurate recall of all times table facts.
- apply their knowledge of the 4 operations by solving a range of single and multiple stepped word problems.

Health and Wellbeing

Through the Building Resilience programme, pupils will explore feelings related to change, disappointment and loss. They will also explore the importance of looking after their mental health.

In PE, pupils will continue to develop strategies, sportsmanship and their ability to work as part of a team through games of Kwik Cricket. They will also further develop their skills of running, jumping and throwing within athletics.

The pupils will also continue to develop their awareness of the outdoor environment and how it can support their wellbeing.
