Through our context for learning, pupils will:

- find key information in non-fiction texts by using contents page, index, headings and sub-headings.
- use this information to create new texts, presenting their writing using illustrations and images.

Through daily literacy activities, pupils will:

- develop their reading fluency and comprehension.
- apply known spelling patterns to all written work and will make use of all taught spelling strategies when attempting to spell unknown words.
- develop their understanding of grammar and sentence structure with a focus on checking their own work according to writing success criteria.

Numeracy and Mathematics

The pupils will:

- apply their multiplication and division skills to find fractions of a number.
- understand that fractions can be recorded as a decimal.
- be able to identify a **right**, **acute** and **obtuse** angle in the environment around them

Health and Wellbeing

Pupils will recognise that we all have similarities and differences but are all unique.

Pupils will recognise their own skills and abilities as well as those of others.

In PE, the children will express their ideas, thoughts and feelings by creating short dance sequences.

They will respond to dance experiences by giving and receiving constructive comments on their own and others' work.
