Term: January — April 2024

Literacy

As appropriate, the learners will:

- Further develop phonic blending and word building skills and introduce new digraph sounds. e.g. 'ai', 'oo", "ee" and "oa"
- Continue to learn to form letters in cursive script
- Explore the features of non-fiction texts
- Create simple information texts including labelled diagrams
- Develop their understanding of basic sentence structure and sentence punctuation (full stops, capital letters and finger spaces)
- Continue to learn to spell and read some tricky words independently
- Listen to short talks and ask appropriate questions to find out more information

Health and Wellbeing

Learners will:

- Discuss how to keep themselves and others safe in a range of situations
- Set goals and celebrate successes especially when we have overcome setbacks

In PE, learners will:

 Develop their ability to work with a partner or within a group and to follow simple rules through the context of badminton and parachute activities

Reading and tricky word lists will be sent home as appropriate.

P.E. will continue to be on a **Monday** and **Tuesday** and our Library Day will be on a **Thursday**.

Numeracy

Learners will:

- Continue to develop addition and subtraction strategies and explore different ways of making the same number
- Recognise, order and use coins in play situations
- Apply addition and subtraction skills in the context of money
- Develop their understanding of time and the language of time, including sequencing activities, reading 'o'clock', knowing the days of the week and the months of the year
- Explore simple fractions e.g. half and whole. Begin to explore division by sharing things equally into groups

How you can help at home...

- Practise initial sounds, digraphs and tricky words regularly and support reading activities
- Encourage your child to be as independent as possible in dressing themselves for winter and organising their belongings
- Use the language of measure in every day situations such as baking and water play
- Practise recognising and counting coins
- Discuss what to do in emergency situations and how to keep themselves safe—attempt to learn a parent/carer phone number or their home address
