Literacy

As appropriate, the pupils will:

- Apply their writing skills to create texts for different purposes e.g. instructions, recipes and a shopping list
- Learn about the features of a non-fiction text and how they can be used to find information
- Begin to include some adjectives and simple connectives in their sentences
- Be encouraged to use cursive script whenever they are writing and begin to join letters
- Revise and continue to develop their ability to spell and write common tricky words
- Continue to learn diagraph sounds and apply these in reading and writing tasks

Health and Wellbeing

Through our Building Resilience unit, 'Make a Difference', the pupils will learn:

- There are things we can do to make the world a better place - small changes can make a big impact
- Identify and discuss a local or world issue that they care about

In PE, pupils will:

 Take part in various athletic activities to develop their throwing, jumping and traveling skills and ability to work as a team

Numeracy

As appropriate, the pupils will:

- Learn to recognise, order and count coins
- Apply addition and subtraction skills to solve simple money problems and use money in play situations, e.g. shopping role-play

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- Collect, organise and display information using simple tally charts and pictograms
- Name, describe and sort 3D shapes
- Continue to develop core numeracy skills and begin to understand simple place value

Home Learning

Tricky words and Big Maths Learn Its (addition facts) practice

- Continue to practise the single letter sounds, diagraphs and tricky words regularly and look out for these sounds when reading books
- Continue to read regularly with your child and ask lots of questions to check for understanding
- Use money as much as possible together.
- Look for 3D shapes around your home and encourage your child to name them: for example this box is a cuboid.
- Discuss the local area and what they see on the way to and from school
- Encourage your child to read environmental print when out and about, for example road signs and shop names
