Nature watch – the flight of the cranes is a publication from the European Commission's Directorate-General for the Environment, designed to educate and entertain children aged 7-11. This publication offers fascinating facts about Europe's bird migration, biodiversity, plus ideas for what children can do themselves to protect the natural environment. 




Achieving Gender Equality in Scotland, Europe and the Rest of the World (2016): This resource was produced in partnership with Montgomery Development Education Centre (MDEC). It explores the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) with a particular focus on SDG 5 Achieving Gender Equality. Designed for use in upper primary school and lower secondary school it contains background information on policies and multiple activities for incorporating into lesson plans.



Finding a Safe Home; Refugees' Journeys to Scotland (2016):

This book explores the Refugee Crisis at a local, national and European level. Through facts and real life stories you will be able to explore the difference between refugees and economic migrants, how many refugees are arriving in Scotland, how communities are assisting and welcoming newcomers, the plight of women and children and the EU effort to mitigate the crisis.



What's it Like in your Country? (2017):
