Literacy

Children will:

- Develop their handwriting skills and apply cursive joins in written work
- Apply known spelling patterns and commonly used words to all written work
- Begin to use a greater variety of adjectives and descriptive phrases through personal writing
- Develop their reading evaluation skills through the context of a novel study (James and the Giant Peach)
- Share personal stories orally and listen to the experiences of others
- Develop their reading fluency, comprehension and expression

<u>Context for Learning— Climate and</u> <u>Weather</u>

Children will:

Explore climate zones around the world and compare and describe how climate affects living things.

In Primary 3, skills knowledge and understanding are developed through a range of teaching and learning opportunities including direct teaching, targeted group time and tailored learning areas in the classroom and outdoor environment.

Numeracy and Maths

Children will:

- Investigate how whole numbers are constructed, understanding the importance of zero within the system and can use their knowledge to explain the link between a digit, its place and its value
- Explore a variety of ways in which data is presented and can ask and answer questions about the information it contains
- Use a range of ways to collect information and can sort it in a logical, organised and imaginative way

Continue to support your child with Reading Home Learning and encourage a variety of texts to be read.

- Discuss, observe and record the changing weather and weather related news topics
- Reading will be set regularly. Please check your child's reading record for group reading homework days
- Tricky Words will be sent home this term, after which children will bring home tricky words when they move up a level. Regular practice of tricky words will take place weekly in class
