Learners will:

- Revise single letter sounds and begin to explore some digraph sounds, e.g. sh, ch, th
- Identify the beginning, middle and end sounds of words
- Further develop their ability to blend and segment sounds to read and write simple words
- Begin to learn cursive handwriting
- Talk and write about personal experiences
- Learn about the features of a simple sentence
- Begin to read and spell common words

Learners will:

- Explore the importance of friendships
- Know who they can turn to for support/help
- Know and demonstrate how to keep ourselves safe when crossing the road and when out and about in the darker nights
