**Learning Intentions****Literacy: Writing****Learning Context: Religious and Moral Education - Christianity****We will be learning to:**

- find and highlight key words in an information text and use these words to create our own text
- use an appropriate style and format to convey relevant information
- develop tools for writing such as, use of paragraphs, extending use of punctuation, presentation of written work, applying known spelling rules

**Literacy: Reading, Listening and Talking****We will be learning to:**

- develop our critical literacy skills
- contribute and share our ideas and opinions with others
- show respect for the views of others
- apply our reading skills and strategies to read and understand texts, for example, making predictions and analysing themes and characters
- support our opinions with some evidence from the texts

**Literacy: Listening and Talking****Learning Context: Church Service****We will be learning to:**

- Plan and deliver an organised presentation
- Communicate clearly, audibly and with expression

**Numeracy and Maths****We will be learning to:**

- develop our addition and subtraction skills
- develop our speed of recall of the times tables and addition facts
- develop our knowledge and skills about time

**Health and Wellbeing****Learning Context: Building Resilience – Be Kind to Others****We will be learning:**

- Kindness makes a difference to ourselves and others.
- Being unkind hurts others and it hurts us too.
- It is important to be kind to yourself.

**P.E.****Learning Context: Dance and Netball****We will be learning to:**

- Develop our hand/eye coordination
- Show mutual respect to team mates and opponents
- Develop rhythm & timing
