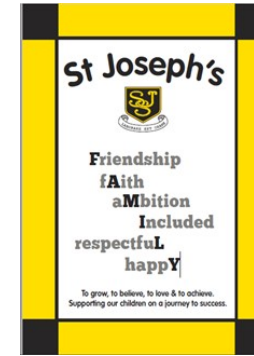

**Children will have increased engagement in learning as a result of high-quality differentiation in the classroom.**

Staff were empowered to take steps through engagement in professional development both individually and collectively to improve outcomes for learners through a focus on differentiation.

School focus on Pupil Participation meant that pupils were encouraged to share their thoughts on preferred teaching and learning styles.

There was a range of learning environments used to meet the needs of all learners in the classes.

**Children will have improved participation in the arenas of participation.**

Pupils take a lead in choosing their class novels.

There has been an increase in sharing the learning at assembly so children have an opportunity to share their success with the school.

Wider Achievement Display was created in the school where children can share photos of their achievements in and out of school.

The following groups were established to support pupils to participate in the life of the school—Junior Road Safety Officers, Pupil Council, Eco Group, Rights Respecting Schools, Sports Council and Reading Rebels.

**Children will increase their engagement and enjoyment in reading.**

There was an increase in the number of pupils who said they enjoyed reading from 68% at the start of the year to 94%.

Increase in Reading attainment from 73% to 88% achieved.

Accelerated Reader is now used P3-7 in school and achievements celebrated at assembly.

Reading rebels have introduced a number of new initiatives to promote reading in the school.

Protected reading time is in all classes.

Staff have chosen books from a wider range of texts and authors to increase the range of texts that children experience in class.
