Five Family Payments

- <u>Best Start Grant Pregnancy and Baby Payment</u> one off payment of up to £754.65 from 24 weeks in pregnancy up until a baby turns 6 months for families who get certain benefits.
- <u>Best Start Grant Early Learning Payment</u> one off payment of £314.45 when a child is between two and three years and six months for families who get certain benefits.
- <u>Best Start Grant School Age Payment</u> one off payment of £314.45 when a child would normally start primary one for families who get certain benefits.
- <u>Best Start Foods</u> a pre-paid card from pregnancy up to when a child turns three for families on certain benefits to help buy healthy food
- <u>Scottish Child Payment</u> £106.80 every four weeks to help towards the costs of looking after each child under 16 for families who get certain benefits

Disability Benefits

- <u>Adult Disability Payment</u> extra money to help people who have a long-term illness or a disability that affects their everyday life. It replaces Personal Independence Payment people in Scotland previously delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions.
- <u>Child Disability Payment</u> extra money to help with the costs of caring for a child with a disability or ill-health condition. It replaces Disability Living Allowance for children in Scotland that was previously delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions.
- <u>Pension Age Disability Payment</u> extra money to help people who have reached State Pension age and have care needs because of a disability or long term ill-health condition. It replaces Attendance Allowance for people in Scotland that was previously delivered by the Department for Work and Pensions.

Carer Benefits

- <u>Carer's Allowance Supplement</u> an automatic payment made twice a year to people who get Carer's Allowance through the Department for Work and Pensions on certain dates each year.
- <u>Young Carer Grant</u> an annual payment of £383.75 for people 16, 17 or 18 who care for people who get a disability benefit for an average of 16 hours a week or more.
- <u>Carer Support Payment</u> money to help you if you're a carer. You can get paid £81.90 a week if you're eligible.

Heating Benefits

- <u>Child Winter Heating Payment</u> a £251.50 payment to help families of a child on the highest rate care component of Disability Living Allowance for Children to heat their homes.
- <u>Winter Heating Payment</u> A yearly payment to help people on low income benefits who might have extra heating needs during the winter. The payment for winter 2024/25 is £58.75.

Other Benefits

- <u>Funeral Support Payment</u> money towards the costs of a funeral at a difficult time like this for people on certain benefits who are responsible for paying for a funeral.
- Job Start Payment £314.45 for 16 to 24 year olds who have been on certain benefits for six months or more to help with the costs of starting a job.
