#### **P7 Transition**



#### **Current Learning**

This term, Chinese New year has sparked the children's interest in exploring colour. We have experimented with mixing paints and explored different shades. Our interest also took us to using powder paints, where we developed our knowledge of measure and cause and effect. We explored how to make the right consistency of paint and what happens when we mix different colours.

We have also been developing our math, literacy and science skills through various baking activities. We have enjoyed making soup, flap jacks and banana bread.

Over the last few weeks we have been gradually reintroducing self-service during snack and lunch. The children have adjusted well to this and are developing their self-help skills, serving themselves really well.







#### **Children's Clothing and Shoes**

Within ELC, our children are able to choose where they want to play and learn. This can include visiting the school library, gym hall or going outdoors. With the weather being quite wet recently lots of children are coming to ELC, wearing welly boots which are essential for outdoor play. However, can we please ask that on wet days children also bring a pair of indoor shoes that they can change into when taking their learning and play indoors. 
