<u>Suncream</u>

As spring approaches, I would like to refer you again to the importance of suncream even on cloudy cooler days. Your child should arrive at nursery already having suncream applied. This







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not only allows your child to go directly out to play but will help to keep congestion down at morning drop off which is already a very busy period.

On days where it may be cooler and cloudy the UV levels can still be classified as moderate and that means you should still apply sun cream protection. Please be assured in the afternoon staff will reapply sunscreen (this must be provided) in line with met-office guidance.

The nursery cannot subsidise the ongoing cost of providing suncream we therefore ask that you provide suncream for your child. We will provide a box where you can leave the suncream (labels will be provided to put your child's name on) there will also be another box for sun hats to ensure these are not misplaced over the day - please put your child's name on the label. The sun cream and sun hats can remain at nursery or taken home daily. Please refer to the met office link to check UV rays anything above 3 throughout the day would recommend using suncream. Suncream should be a new bottle, and the first use should be applied by parents at home in case of any reactions or allergies then staff can date the cream as the have an expiry of 12 months from opening.

Graduation

We will be holding our children's graduation celebration on Wednesday the 11th of June. Children in the green, silver, orange, yellow and pink will have their celebration at 10am and children within the red, purple, gold and blue group will have their celebration at 2pm. We hope you can join us to celebrate your children's journey at Forth Nursery and wish all the children the best on their journey moving forward into Primary 1.
