


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Primary 1 Enrolment



You will need your child's full birth certificate – abbreviated versions will not be accepted, as well as 2 proofs of address dated within the last 6 months. These documents should be uploaded with your application.

If you intend to defer your child's entry to school they still have to be registered at their catchment school and the deferral box has to be checked.

Should you wish to complete a placing request to another primary school they must initially be registered at their catchment school and a placing request application be completed to the desired school. Please note where a placing request to attend another school is made the automatic right to a place a Forth Primary is lost regardless of the outcome of the placing request.

Gala Committee Meeting



The Parent Council will be hosting a Valentine Disco on Thursday 12 February in the school hall. The timings of the discos are:


P1-3 6pm-7:15pm

Please note the school and nursery will be closed from Monday 16 February – Wednesday 18 February for mid-term holidays and staff in-service training. Pupils should not attend on these days.





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

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
Correspondence



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



Welcome back!

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

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Christmas Fun

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
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Christmas sing-a-long

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

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Church visit

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

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Big Cook Little Cook

Registering for school

If your child will turn 5 between 1st March 2026 and 28 February 2027 you need to register them for starting school.

You should complete the online registration form from Mon 5th Jan 2026.

If you are accessing an additional year at nursery and have spoken to your key worker you should still enrol at your catchment school and speak to Sharon to complete an additional form. All information regarding the process can be found within your child's journal.
