Nursery update, a few words from Mrs Griffiths - These past few weeks in Nursery we have been adapting to our new routines, full days and the pod system that is now in place. We have been focussing on Health and Wellbeing including forming new relationships, developing independence and learning about emotions. Books including The Colour Monster and Emotion Works resources have been used to aid our learning and develop vocabulary around emotions. The children have been encouraged to think about their own emotions using visuals during self-registration each day.

This week across the pods there have been many experiences planned to develop knowledge of number, shape and colour. You can find out more about these on your child's Online Learning Journal. We have also been making the most of our outdoor spaces, with each pod having both a morning and afternoon outdoor slot. This will continue even as the weather begins to get cooler. As such we would appreciate if you could ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for the weather with a cosy jacket, hat and gloves. It is also beneficial for your child to bring a spare change of clothes to nursery every day.
