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Nursery News

Learning Across the Curriculum:

The children have been taking part in a range of across the curriculum learning opportunities and becoming confident individuals. All children will be given the opportunity to take part in opportunities throughout the year. This is giving the children experiences to learn and develop in different areas of the curriculum and build confidence and knowledge in new skills. Thank you to all parents who have attended different sessions, we appreciate your support.

Play on Peddles



The children have all gained amazing confidence in safety checking the bikes, learning about balance and working out the best way to gain speed before lifting their feet off the ground. Each session the children recaped the previous week, discussing safety and carrying out our safety checks before getting on the bike. They then carried out a safety check on the bike, ensuring that the wheels were not flat, the handlebars were tight and the seat was at the right height for them. After that they chose a helmet and explored how to tighten the straps and the back, talking about the importance of wearing a helmet.











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The children have worked on controlling the bike and making use of the space given, they have followed instructions going around the cones ensuring to keep a safe distance from the others. Cones were set out for the children to weave in and out of, then focused on running with both feet to gain some speed then when they reached the cones lifting both legs off the ground to see how far they could balance.

The children spent some time thinking about safety before, during and after using our bike. The children got to know the different parts of the bike, talking about the seat, wheels and handlebars, discussing their experiences of using a bike and what kind we have riden before. Then the children had some free time to explore moving the bike and think about spacial awareness when controlling the bike.

Big Cook Little Cook



As part of a celebration for Burns' day some children baked Scottish shortbread. A small group of P6 children joined us in the butterfly room to work alongside the nursery children to help support them. We discussed Burns' day and shortbread being a Scottish sweet treat we could make to share with all our friends in nursery. We gathered the ingredient, scales, bowls, wooden spoons, then discussed and looked at the recipes. The children were placed into groups of two to work alongside the P6 helper. With support each child measured the ingredients following the recipe. Each child took turns to mix and crumble the ingredients together forming a dough like texture. Using the rolling pin we rolled out the dough and took turns at cutting out circular biscuits to put on the tray before baking. Throughout the experience











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all children listened carefully to the instructions, they worked well together, waiting their turn and being patient.

Once the biscuits were made they were individually packed for each child to take home.

Forest Friends



All children who are heading to school will have the opportunity to take part in a block of forest friends. Lorraine and Debbie have introduced forest friends in addition to outdoor learning activities. The children will have the opportunity to participate in planned activities alongside their natural environment. These opportunities will include a variety of experiences beyond the curriculum, which will include risky play, assessing dangers, using tools and fire safety. We will be using a part of the school grounds to ensure boundaries. Thereafter it is intended to visit the local woodlands in Forth for the remaining weeks.Lorraine and Debbie have been lucky enough to have necessary training to support this project and first aid trained. We successfully managed to secure funding to support this program and have the necessary resources and equipment. This includes an outdoor toilet which allows privacy, and we have all the necessary hygiene equipment.











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<u>Bookbug</u>



Lianne has been running regular book bug sessions and would like to pass her thanks to all the parents/carers who have been able to attend so far. Each week there has been a different focus of learning through the use of songs and stories. The children explored traditional nursery rhymes within the 1st session. Then explored transport for a session. Then opportunities to explore rhythm and movement was provided. The block was then finished with the Colour Monster. All the children have been keen to share their time at book bug with their friends.

<u>PEEP</u>



Carole has been running taster PEEP sessions and will be starting a block in the near future to support children's learning and development. Thank you to all the parents/carers who attended our taster sessions and please look out for our future dates. Lynn has supported during these sessions with promoting the use of Makaton which is the use of simple signs alongside the spoken word to support children's communication.
