Dear pupils, parents/carers and friends of Rattray

As spring blossoms and Easter approaches, we're excited to share the latest news from Rattray as we prepare for a fantastic break! We encourage parents and guardians to stay connected with us as we progress through the rest of the school year. We have several upcoming events in the next few weeks that we'd love to inform you about.

We have had a number of events which have happened in our school since our last newsletter. All pupils benefitted from participating in Global Play Day and World Book Day. Our P3/4 and P4/5 pupils visited Stirling Castle which enhanced their Mary Queen of Scots learning, whilst as part of their World War 2 topic P5 visited the War Museum at Edinburgh Castle. We are in the process of arranging excursions for some other classes based on classroom learning, and we will inform you of these in due course.

Additionally, we have had several visitors supporting learning across the school which has been most valuable to our pupils. Our P7s are currently working with SCYD (Blairgowrie youth group) on a drug education programme. Our upper school classes have also had informative talks with St. Johnstone around racism, the Police and Community Warden around safe choices and have participated in First Aid sessions. They also joined in Generation Science workshops around the theme of sustainability.

Our P6s are currently taking part in a Salmon project facilitated by Perthshire Wildlife, which has a biodiversity focus on the falling numbers of salmon returning naturally to our river systems. The project is twofold to attempt to increase the successful falling number of salmon to return and spawn naturally as well as to educate children about climate change and potential contributing factors. As part of the project the class will be able to visit a salmon hatchery.

In the coming weeks all P3 and P4 pupils will have weekly tennis coaching sessions with local coach Susan Whiteford, whilst P6 and P6/7 are enjoying cricket coaching with cricket development officer 'Reg'. These sessions will culminate in a local tennis and cricket tournament, unfortunately we can't take all the children along to these tournaments, but we will let you know who has been selected.

We have several upper school pupils representing our school in the coming weeks. At the PKC cross country championship next Tuesday, seventeen pupils will pull on the burgundy sportswear, four P6 pupils (Jude Downie, Nathan Kemp, Liza Kazanchuk and Liliana Petrovska) will take part in the Euros Quiz, whilst four P7 children will participate in the annual Rotary Quiz (Max Downie, Finlay Mackenzie, Shaih Kempton and Sophie Wemyss). Alongside this Sophie and Max will also take part in the 'Perform in Perth' instrumental competition. We wish all our school representatives the best of luck, we will update you in due course.

This term all our primary school pupils will have weekly learning added to their journals and we invite you to discuss these with your child and comment on their posts. Teachers will also be sending weekly messages with you through the app, and school will use this to communicate some information too.

By the end of this school year, we hope to be sharing most school information through Just2EasyMessage. Eventually we will be sharing Homework through Jusy2 easy too. We appreciate that there are now many forms of school communication, however we are hopeful that Just2Easy will eventually lead to the streamlining of this.

Pupil Safety and Wellbeing

The safety of our children is everyone's responsibility, parents, pupils and staff. Therefore, we appeal to all parents and carers regarding the habits/incidents below which are happening most days and ask you to consider the consequences of your individual actions on the safety of all children coming and going to school.

Please help us keep our children safe by following the rules below:

- No parking or waiting in the staff car park. 24 Hour access is required for emergency services and deliveries. If you require access to the disabled bay and you have a blue badge, please phone in advance to our school office and we will open the car park gates.
- No drop off/collection on the white zig zags outside the school gates. These areas are monitored by Police Scotland and tickets will be issued.
- No dogs in the school playground, regardless of how young or how friendly your dog is. We have several children who are frightened of dogs, and we also do not want dogs fouling the playground.
- No smoking or vaping in our school playground.

We appreciate and expect your assistance in these matters. If a friend or family member drops off/collects your child(ren) on your behalf, please can you share this important information with them?
