Rattray Primary School Registration 2024

If your child is turning five up to and including the 28 February 2025, they are eligible to start school in **August 2024** and you should register your child for primary school. However, nearer to the start of the school year you may wish to delay your child's entry to school if you think that they are not ready to start. You can registrar online following this link. <u>Apply online</u>. Please note, you will need to provide:

- 1. your child's birth certificate
- 2. your current Council Tax notice and
- 3. a recent utility bill

Although it is usual for children to attend their local catchment area school, you have the right to make a <u>placing</u> <u>request</u> asking that your child be granted a place in a school other than your local catchment area school. The closing date for submitting a placing request for session 2024/25 is **Friday 15 March 2024**. If submitting a placing request, you should not register your child at the local catchment school.
