Dear parents/carers and friends of Rattray

Firstly, thank you to all those who managed along to our open afternoon last term and to our parent contact evenings recently. We hoped you enjoyed seeing the learning in your child's classroom, alongside hearing about your child's progress. We are delighted that over the course of these events so many of our school families have been able to attend.

It is hard to believe that the hectic Christmas season is almost here. As we approach the end of another term, December promises to be an exceptionally busy month at Rattray Primary School. Our staff have been hard at work planning ways to make this season truly magical for all our pupils and families, and I want to extend my gratitude to them for their efforts. Again, we've pulled together a wonderful array of festive activities for the children. In addition to these seasonal events, there are a number of other items to share with you.

This term P3 and P3/4 have been receiving cricket coaching every Wednesday afternoon from Reg, the local cricket development officer. Our P5 class have been supporting budding high school sports coaches, as every Wednesday morning the class are visited by one of the Blairgowrie High PE teachers and some high school pupils (including former pupils) who coach PE and sport to the class. Returning ex-pupils is a theme at Rattray and we are lucky to have three ex-pupils (Cody, Anya and Sarah) now in 4th year who are visiting our school every week for work experience.

Welcome to our school

We have had two new pupils join us since our last newsletter, Olivia Watts in Mrs Strachan's P7 class and brother Ben Watts in Mr Masterton's P5 class. Also joining us is Lacey Kerr in Mrs Bruce's P6/7 class. Staffing Update

I have several staffing updates to share with you. First, I am both delighted and saddened to announce that Mrs. Fiona McCarthy (P6 class teacher) has successfully interviewed for a temporary secondment as Acting Depute Head Teacher at Newhill Primary School. This is an excellent opportunity for Mrs. McCarthy and is thoroughly well-deserved. She will begin her new role as soon as we have a suitable replacement for her P6 class, and her secondment will continue until at least December 2025. We wish her every success in this exciting new challenge.

Secondly, Miss Erin Cassels (P4/5 class teacher) has accepted a permanent teaching position at Milnathort Primary School, bringing her closer to home and providing her with a permanent post, something we could not offer at Rattray due to her current role covering a secondment. Miss Cassels will transition to her new post in two weeks. In the meantime, Ms. Gregg will cover her class until a suitable replacement is found. We extend our best wishes to Miss Cassels as she embarks on this new chapter.

This means there are now teaching vacancies in both the P4/5 and P6 classes. These positions are being advertised nationally, and I expect to conduct interviews next week. I hope to share the details of the new class teachers with you very soon.

Finally, it is with sadness that we say goodbye to our Facilities Assistant (Jannie), Mr. Martin Hogg. Martin has been promoted to Area Supervisor for Tayside Contracts Angus. He is highly regarded and much loved by both staff and pupils here at Rattray, and his departure will be deeply felt. However, this well-deserved promotion is a testament to his hard work and dedication, and we know he will excel in his new role. Martin will leave us in two weeks, and his position is currently being advertised on the Tayside Contracts website.

Please join me in wishing Mrs. McCarthy, Miss Cassels, and Mr. Hogg all the very best in their new roles.

Pupil Council

The Pupil Council met with Lara and Holly from Empowering Families, following a pupil survey last session. In our meeting Lara and Holly shared their findings on what the pupils at Rattray like and do not like about their local community. The Pupil Council have now identified that they would like to design a campaign to encourage people to use the dog waste bins in the local community. Their next step is to conduct a survey to find out where the bins are and how many there are, and then following this, Empowering Families will support the Pupil Council with their campaign.

Assessing Children's Progress

As you may be aware National Standardised Assessments have been introduced across all schools in Scotland, and each year pupils in Primaries One, Four and Seven are assessed in schools locally and nationally. This is part of the Scottish Governments commitment to raising standards across Scottish Education. Testing of our P7 and P4 pupils will take place this term.

Appropriate clothing for winter weather

Please can we ask that your child comes to school each day with a coat and appropriate footwear. It is important that our pupils get plenty of exercise and fresh air, so children will be outdoors for break and lunchtimes in all weathers (except torrential rain and high winds). During the school week, children will spend periods learning outdoors too, therefore it's always best to be prepared.

Pupil Absence and Lateness

<u>Absent</u> - If your child is to be absent from the school for any reason, please contact the school (01250 871980) as soon as possible on the morning of the absence and before 9.30am. If a staff member does not answer the phone, please do leave a message on our voicemail system. If there has been no parental contact by 9.30am staff will send a text message to enquire as to your child's absence. If we do not hear from you, this absence will be classed as unexplained and unauthorised. This is normal procedure across Scotland. Your support in this is much appreciated.

<u>Lateness</u> - If your child is going to be late, please call us to let us know their lunch choice for that day as we must report to the kitchen by no later than 10.15am. Late lunch choices cannot be accommodated after this time, due to kitchen deadlines. This also includes children who change their mind midway through the morning.

Term-time Holidays

A little reminder that whilst we appreciate some family holidays can only take place during term-time, council guidance is that these holidays will be marked in school as an unauthorised absence and no schoolwork will be given. This will be done even if you have told the school you intend to take your child on holiday. Further information can be found at the this link.

Contacting Staff

Teaching staff are available at the end of the school day on most days to discuss any general matters or concerns you have. Mr Brown (our school depute) or myself (Mrs Robertson, Headteacher) are usually in the playground before the start of the school day and at the end of the school day. However, if you are concerned about something, no matter how trivial, and you are unable to speak to us at these times please do not hesitate to contact the school office and we will contact you as soon as we can.
