





# **NOVEMBER 2021 NEWSLETTER**

Dear pupils, parents/carers and friends of Rattray

It's hard to believe that the hectic Christmas Season is almost upon us. As we race towards the end of another term it is going to be a very busy December for Rattray Primary School. At the moment, we are hoping that our Christmas celebrations are not hampered by pandemic restrictions, however if they are, similar to last year we will endeavour to be as creative as possible. The staff have once again been busy thinking about how to make this a magical time in school for all our pupils and families, and I would like to thank them all for their efforts. Mrs Johnstone (otherwise known as Mrs Christmas) has pulled together a wonderful array of festive fun for the children this year. Alongside these winter events, there are several other items I wish to draw to your attention.

## **Pupil Council**

The Pupil Council this term looked and discussed the feedback pupils gave, in relation to the relationships survey that was carried out. Pupils were very positive about relationships. This term our focus has been on "feedback that helps me learn." Pupils shared good examples of feedback that they have received from their teachers, and how this was used to support them in their learning. This was then shared with teachers, and they are thinking about to use the good practice in other classes in their own class.

## Ongoing School Refurbishment and Extension

Our extensive school refurbishment continues, and many parts of the school are already looking fantastic. Our office areas and all classrooms from P3 to P7 have been fully decorated, recarpeted, refloored and refurnished. Our P1, P1/2 and P2 classes are currently decanted from their classrooms, whilst their rooms are being refurbished. This project will last until Summer 2022. The school and nursery will look very different when the works have been completed, and we do hope that you will be able to visit our school to see the ongoing works very soon.

### **Assessing Children's Progress**

As you may be award National Standardised Assessments have been introduced across all schools in Scotland, and each year pupils in Primaries One, Four and Seven are assessed in schools locally and nationally. This is part of the Scottish Governments commitment to raising standards across Scottish Education. Testing of our P4 pupils will take place this term. #### **ParentPay**

As per our App message last week, any pupil not signed up to ParentPay have been given activation codes home with them. ParentPay is the school's online payment system. Rattray Primary is a cashless school with all dinner money, trips, school shows etc all paid online. Most importantly, we send all our school communication and newsletters via ParentPay. In order to access the system, can we please ask you to log on to ParentPay and activate the account using the codes in the activation letter. We have lots of activities and fun days coming up and all details will be sent to parents on ParentPay, which means you might miss some events for your child. Please contact the school office if you require any help with this.

#### **Poppies and Armistice Day**

Thank you to everyone who has purchased a poppy, our school have raised £64 so far for the Poppy Scotland appeal.

## **Appropriate clothing for the weather**

Please can we ask that your child comes to school each day with a coat and appropriate footwear. Currently due to Covid 19 restrictions, there is less movement around school which means the children are spending longer periods of time in their classrooms. It is important that our pupils get plenty of exercise and fresh air, so children will be outdoors for break and lunchtimes in all weathers (except torrential rain and high winds).

#### **PE Times and Kit**

All our classes have at least two sessions of PE each week. Until further notice, children can come to school without uniform and wearing suitable sportswear (no football colours) on these days. Current advice is that all physical activity can be taken both indoor and outdoor. Changing rooms will not be used. Please note that on these days, jewellery should not be worn, and long hair should also be tied back. Can we also ask that children bring indoor PE shoes to school on their gym days too?

#### **Christmas Cards**

Thanks to all families who have purchased Christmas cards, this has raised £261 for school funds. Thanks to the class teachers who in supporting this allowed Christmas to come early in their classes. A huge thanks to Mrs Russell of P3, who every year organises us all and makes sure the children's Christmas card designs are created, sent home and returned to the Cauliflower cards in plenty of time for families to receive them for Christmas.
