We have also benefited from additional days with Mrs Gillian Gallacher in school, Gillian is a School Support Assistant within the Carluke Learning Community whose work is focused on COVID Recovery.

P.7/6 Holocaust Memorial Day

On Friday 21st January, P.7/6 produced a video presentation to mark Holocaust Memorial Day. The children showed sensitivity and compassion as they led reflection and remembrance of genocide not only of the Jewish people but of those in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur.



House Captain Event

Friday 25th February is our next House Captain Event. The Captains and Vice Captains have chosen to link this with Fairtrade Fortnight and the theme of "choose the world you want". With this in mind, children are invited to choose the clothes they want to wear (no football colours).

Competition was fierce between the Houses during our Ultimate Dodgeball British Heart



Foundation event on Monday 7th February. Not only was it a great way for the children to get active, but it is a fantastic way to raise funds for our school and for the BHF's life-saving research. BHF is an organisation important to us as there are members of our school community affected by heart conditions. Coincidentally, all Houses gained the same number of points

so have 250 added to their total for the month.

We have raised £711 – this is incredible! The school retains 20% of the money raised which means we have £142.20 which will be used towards purchasing another Clever Touch

British Science Week

British Science Week is on 11th-20th March. This is a celebration of the world of science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM). We are keen to develop the children's interests and skills in this area. If you or a family member work within any of these fields, we are keen to hear from you as we'd like to arrange some talks for the children.



COVID-19 Update

Many of the COVID-19 restrictions for wider society ceased on Monday 24th January 2022. The restrictions in place for schools remain tighter. We are still required to:

- No large gatherings of children e.g. assemblies etc.
- Minimising contacts between classes indoors.
- One ways system in corridor (keep left and right).
- Staff wearing masks in all communal areas and when unable to maintain a distance from pupils.
- Enhanced cleaning of touch points and high use areas e.g. toilets, dining areas etc.
- Enhanced hand hygiene measures.

Please continue to follow these rules:

- All adults must wear a face covering in all areas of the school grounds (unless medically exempt).
- Keep the number of adults dropping off or collecting children to a minimum.

New schools guidance is being introduced from Monday 28th February 2022 and we will write to parents with how this impacts our existing arrangements.

COVID Self-Isolation

The guidance around self-isolation was revised by the Scottish Government on 6th January 2022. The following will give you some important and helpful information around self-isolation rules.

In the event of a pupil; testing positive, parents must inform the school as soon as possible. Track and track do not inform schools on parents' behalf.

Positive cases are advised to self-isolate for 10 days. However, if the individual returns two consecutive negative LFD tests taken at least 24 hours apart with the first test no earlier than day 6 they may end isolation before the end of the 10 day period if they have no fever.

Close contacts who are fully vaccinated, having received 3 doses of the vaccination (plus 14 days) or are aged under 18 years and 4 months, can take daily LFD tests for 7 days instead of isolation - provided the tests are negative and they remains without symptoms. If someone has not received 3 doses of the vaccination, they will need to book a PCR test and even if this is a negative result, they will need to isolate for 10 days.

Advice on confirmatory PCR tests where people test positive on a lateral flow device (LFD) test they are now not advised to get a PCR test to confirm infection but to follow isolation advice as it applies to them as a positive case – there is an exception for people who may be eligible for the Self-Isolation Support Grant who are advised to take a PCR test to ensure they can confirm their infection to be potentially eligible for financial support.

'Warn and Inform' Letters

When a positive case is confirmed in a pupil, a 'Warn and Inform' letter from NHS Lanarkshire is emailed to all parents/carers **of that class only.** This provide the most recent guidance on what your child is required to do re lateral flow testing etc. We have been asked to adopt a sensible approach to issuing these e.g. multiple copies will not be issued in the same week to same class.

Pupil Voice

We are actively developing pupil participation in the wider life of the school through increasing the range of Pupil Voice Groups (committees). This offers children the chance to make decisions about the life and work of the school. All members of teaching and support staff lead a group, and our groups have representatives from every class and all primary stages.
