Pupil Equity Funding (PEF)

Pupil Equity Funding is additional funding allocated directly to schools to work towards closing the poverty related attainment gap.

The Scottish Government has committed to this funding as part of the Scottish Attainment Challenge programme. High Mill Primary School has been awarded £49680 for 2024/2025. Details of our priorities for this funding is included in our SIP, previously a separate plan was published. After the Spring holiday, Mrs Cairns our Equity Lead will be in touch to seek views on how we use the PEF money next session.

OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning)

As part of our school improvement work next session, we are delighted to be undertaking the OPAL programme in partnerhsip with Play Scotland. OPAL is a strategic, values based approach to play across all ages. It is a partnership which looks at all areas schools must plan for to improve the quality of play opportunities including environment, resources and culture.



The OPAL Primary Programme has been independently proven to sustainably improve the quality of play in primary schools. Research shows that play contributes to children's physical and emotional health, wellbeing, approach to learning and enjoyment of school.
