Name	<b>Lost Property</b> Please can we ask that all parents put names on jumpers / coats so we can return items to children quickly. It's amazing how these are piling up already.

	variety of clubs including Chess, German, Hockey, Biking and more. The Electives start up on the
	first Tuesday back to school in Term 2. Children will make their choices this week.
Spelling	Morning routines in school – This term we continued with our Discovery Time start to each
	morning. That is, children start off the day engaging in 15 minutes of play that develops skills and
	helps them get 'warmed up' each morning. In Term 2 we are planning a change. We recognise
	from our recent whole-school assessment findings and general review of jotters that spelling
	requires some attention. So, in Term 2 P2 – 7 children will start each morning with active spelling
	practice. Through this daily routine of 15 minutes targeted time, we hope learners will become
	more proficient at remembering spellings. We will keep you informed of our findings! Please
	help by ensuring your child arrives promptly each day so they don't miss out on this.
	<b>Last day of Term 1</b> we invite the P1-7 children to enjoy a 'dress down day' on Friday 6 <sup>th</sup> October.
	This is a free treat, no collection/charity involved. Some children have asked if they can wear
	football tops. We will say 'yes' on this occasion, and remind everyone to remain respectful about
	what others wear. Usually schools say 'no' to football tops as it can heighten emotions – but we
	will trust Abernethy children to make good choices about their behaviour as this is a treat!
	<b>Snacks in school</b> – we are noticing an increase in the number of sweeties being brought to
	school, as morning snack and in packed lunch boxes. Our playground litter-picking is providing
	evidence of many more sweeties too. We would ask, where possible, that children bring
	healthier snacks that will be kinder to teeth and boost brain activity for longer than sweeties do.
