Number

- Revision of addition to 20.
- Subtraction within 20.
- Quick recall of addition and subtraction facts to 20.

Time

- Telling the time using analogue and digital 12-hour clocks.
- Linking am and pm to specific times of the day.
- Using calendars and reciting the months of the year.
- Recalling the number of seconds in a minute and minutes in an hour.
- Using timers.

Measure

- Measuring, estimating and comparing lengths, weight and height.
- Exploring units of measurement and measurement tools.
