

Numeracy and Mathematics

All children will be challenged at a pace appropriate to their learning.

The majority of children will be developing skills in:

- Number formation
- Counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Ordering and identifying numbers to 20
- Matching number symbol to quantity (to 20)
- Using mathematical symbols (+, =)
- Using a range of strategies to add within 5/10
- Adding mentally within 5/10
- Addition stories to 5/10
- Adding on 1 or 2 numbers to 5/10

Measure

- Using different language to describe and compare the size, weight, length of an object
- Using non-standard units to measure different items

Estimating

- Using estimation in the contexts of number and measure

ICT

Pupils will continue to practise logging on to the computer. Pupils will now match lowercase letters to capitals and become familiar with key icons on the computer screen.



Literacy

Children will be developing skills in:

- Phonics, Common Words & Spelling – learning the name and sound of each letter, blending letters together to make words, identifying words beginning with and correct formation.
- Reading books corresponding to their book band. Children will enhance their understanding of the books through comprehension and reading activities.
- Writing - they will continue to learn to write sentences and applying their knowledge of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to construct a sentence.
