Literacy

Through consistency of approach in the teaching of writing as well as a continued emphasis on developing a culture of reading in our school, attainment in Literacy for all children will be improved.

Writing

- An audit of the approaches to teaching writing and associated resources will be carried out.
- All staff will be consulted in the development of a whole school approach to writing.

Reading

- All stakeholders will work towards gaining Gold Level Reading School accreditation
- All stakeholders will use Giglets to support the development of reading for pleasure and reading comprehension.
- Parents and carers will be encouraged to use the reading rings with their children and to attend the 'Read with the ROMPS Royal Readers' events to promote a love of reading.

Numeracy

To raise attainment in Numeracy.

- 3 staff members will be trained in Maths Recovery.
- New resources will be sourced for Numeracy and Maths.
- There will be a greater focus on Number Talks and Problem Solving.

Health and Wellbeing

To support the mental, social and physical Health and Wellbeing of all children across the School.

- All staff will implement regular yoga mindfulness sessions.
- The PE programme will be updated.
- The Emotion Works programme will be embedded throughout the curriculum
- We will work towards Gold Right's Respecting School status.
- The new Promoting Positive Relationships Position Statement will be shared with all stakeholders.
- Skills will continue to be developed through our Forest School and Outdoor Learning programmes.

Parental Engagement

To share learning, progress and achievements of all pupils regularly with parents/carers.

- All teaching staff will be trained on the use of Evidence Me and Evisense.
- Parents and carers will be invited to sign up to Evidence Me and Evisense.
- All teaching staff will share meaningful skill development across the curriculum regularly with parents and carers.

STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics)

To increase access to and participation in STEM learning for all pupils.

- Staff will begin to provide interactive learning experiences in STEM to engage and motivate learners.
- P6 and P7 pupils will be trained as Young STEM Leaders.
- A Tech Team consisting of P5-7 pupils will be developed and trained to become 'Digital Leaders' in our school.
- Following Google Certified Educator training, workshops will be delivered to pupils, parents/carers and staff.
- The 'Bring your own Device' initiative will be trailed with P7 pupils in Term 4.

Cost of the School Day

To address financial barriers at school for families and children.

- Cost of the School Day Calendar will be created.
- A Cost of the School Day leaflet will be created outlining financial support available to parents and carers.
- Cost of the School Day policy will be written.
