

Numeracy and Maths

All children will be challenged at a pace appropriate to their learning.

The majority of children will be developing skills in:

Number

- Revision of numbers to 20
- Revision of addition stories to 10
- Using mathematical symbols (+, -, =)
- Using a range of strategies to subtract within 10
- Subtracting mentally within 10
- Subtracting 1 or 2 numbers up to 10
- Solving missing number equations e.g. $3 + _ = 10$

Time

- Linking daily routines to time sequences
- Days of the week, months and the four seasons
- Reading analogue/digital clocks to o'clock (12 hour)
- Using appropriate language in relation to time

Fractions

- Split a whole into smaller equal parts
- Describe each part as half or quarter
- Share out a group of items equally into smaller

Literacy

Children will be developing skills in:

- Phonics and spelling, using a variety of active strategies to enhance formation. They will also continue to practise blending 3 or more letter words using their knowledge of taught sounds and identifying where the sounds come in a word i.e. beginning, middle, end, and working on instant recognition.
- Handwriting – forming correctly on a line and joining taught phonemes e.g. sh, th
- Reading books corresponding to their book band
- Writing – they will continue to practise using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. They will also continue to practise using connectives e.g. 'and' 'because'. We will be learning how to develop our imaginative and functional writing skills.
