

Numeracy and Mathematics

We will be working on the following topics in Numeracy, which will be differentiated:

- Place value to 100.
- Number formation to 100.
- Identifying numbers before, between or after.
- Identifying more/less than a given number to 100.
- Partitioning numbers to 100.
- Counting in 2s, 5s and 10s to 100.
- Sequencing numbers within 100, starting with either the largest or smallest number.
- Identifying odd and even numbers.
- Addition within 20/100.
- Shape, pattern and symmetry.

We will use active strategies to support their learning: Numicon, ICT, Concrete materials, Number lines and squares.

Health and Wellbeing

Emotion Works

We will be introducing the 5 cog model which makes links between our emotions, behaviours, triggers and identifies strategies to help overcome these.

Children will learn to identify and discuss people who keep them safe both in and out of school.
