- Counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Ordering numbers to 20
- Matching number symbol to quantity (to 20)

- Using a range of strategies to add within 5
- Adding mentally within 5
- Addition stories to 5
- Adding on 1 or 2 numbers to 5

- Using different language to describe and compare the size, weight, length of an object
- Using non-standard units to measure different items
