The majority of children will be developing skills in:

- Number formation and recognition to 20
- Counting forwards and backwards to 20
- Ordering and sequencing numbers to 20
- Matching number symbol to quantity (to 20)
- Using mathematical symbols (+, =)
- Using a range of materials to add within 5/10
- Problem solving strategies
- Adding mentally within 5/10
- Addition stories to 5/10
- Adding on 1 or 2 numbers to 5/10

- Using different language to describe and compare the size, weight, length of an object
- Using non-standard units to measure different items
