

Numeracy and Mathematics

We will be working on the following topics in Numeracy, which will be differentiated:

Number:

- Revision of numbers to 20
- Revision of addition stories to 10
- Using mathematical symbols (+, -, =)
- Using a range of strategies to subtract within 10
- Subtracting mentally within 10
- Subtracting 1 or 2 numbers up to 10
- Solving missing number equations e.g $3 + _ = 10$

Time

- Linking daily routines to time sequences
- Days of the week, months and four seasons
- Reading analogue/digital clock to o'clock (12 hour)
- Using appropriate language in relation to time

Fractions

- Split a whole into smaller equal parts
- Describe each part as half or quarter
- Share out a group of items equally into smaller

Literacy

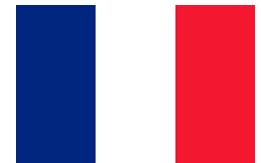
Children will be developing skills in:

- Phonics and Spelling – These will be developed through using a variety of active spelling strategies.
- Reading – The pupils will continue on the reading programme in accordance with their book band.
- Writing – Pupils will learn to create fact files, imaginative story writing, personal writing and poetry.
- Handwriting – Pupils will work on joining their phonemes weekly and will be expected to transfer their joins into daily writing work.

Children will continue developing skills in:

- Personal information

Science Electricity & Forces



All children will explore the importance and dangers of electricity in daily lives, objects requiring mains or battery energy and be able to describe how electrical appliances use electrical energy and transform it into light, heat or sound energy. Children will be able to recognise simple types of forces and describe their effects.
