All children will be challenged at a pace appropriate to their learning.

The majority of children will be developing skills in:

Number:

- Revision of numbers to 20
- Revision of addition stories to 10
- Using mathematical symbols (+, -, =)
- Using a range of strategies to subtract within 5/10
- Subtracting mentally within 10
- Problem Solving and Number Talk strategies
- Subtracting 1 or 2 numbers up to 5/10
- Solving missing number equations
e.g $3 + _ = 10$

Time

- Linking daily routines to time sequences
- Days of the week, months and four seasons
- Reading analogue/digital clock to o'clock (12 hour)
- Using appropriate language in relation to time

Fractions

- Split a whole into smaller equal parts
- Describe each part as half or quarter
- Share out a group of items equally into smaller

Learning Across the Curriculum

This term, we are learning about Lanark then and now. We will cover a variety of curricular areas including: Expressive Arts, Literacy, Technologies and Social Studies. Learning experiences will include:

Children will learn about features of (New) Lanark and how people lived in the past. They will be aware that different types of evidence help them to learn about the past and make links by exploring items and images.



Literacy

Children will be developing skills in:

- Phonics – learning the name and sound of each letter, blending letters together to read words and correct letter formation.
- Common words/spelling – to read and spell using active strategies and knowledge of phonemes.
- Reading - books corresponding to their book band, comprehension skills and enhancing vocabulary
- Listening & Talking strategies
- VCOP (learning to include Vocabulary, Connectives, Openers and Punctuation in their sentence writing)

French

Through daily routines, children will develop skills in:

- Food
- Numbers to 10/20
- Calendar (days/months of the year)



Learning Across the Curriculum

Science Electricity & Forces



All children will explore the importance and dangers of electricity in daily lives, objects requiring mains or battery energy and be able to describe how electrical appliances use electrical energy and transform it into light, heat or sound energy. Children will be able to recognise simple types of forces (push/pull) and describe their effects.
