Numeracy and Mathematics

All children will develop skills in:

- Rounding whole numbers to the nearest 1000, 10 000 and 100 000 or to 1, 2 or 3 significant figures.
- Rounding decimal fractions to the nearest whole number, to one decimal place and two decimal places and/or rounding to any given number of significant figures.
- Applying knowledge of rounding to give an estimate to a calculation.
- Focusing on quick methods to carry out a variety of mental calculations (addition, subtraction and/or multiplication and division) or knowing the correct order of operations (BOMDAS) to solve basic calculation.
- Identifying 3D objects and 2D shapes using specific vocabulary including regular, irregular, radius, diameter, and circumference.
- Demonstrating understanding of the relationship between 3D objects and their nets.

These topics will be differentiated accordingly.

Health and Wellbeing

Children will be developing skills in:

- Knowing that we all experience a variety of thoughts and emotions that affect how we feel and behave and learning ways of managing them.
- Exploring the rights to which I and others are entitled, I am able to exercise these rights appropriately and accept the responsibilities that go with them.
- Recognising that each individual has a unique blend of abilities and needs. I contribute to making my school community one which values individuals equally and is a welcoming place for all.

Literacy

Children will be developing skills by:

- Contributing relevant ideas, information and opinions when engaging with their reading book or class novel (Wonder).
- Using reading strategies such as predicting, scanning, clarifying and summarising to develop their reading comprehension skills.
- Responding to literal and inferential questions, to develop a clear understanding of the text.
- Recognising the techniques used by authors to influence the reader, for example, word choice, emotive language and rhetorical questions.
- Selecting and using spelling patterns, rules and strategies to spell most words accurately through Active Literacy
- Creating writing pieces across different writing genres, including imaginative, report and procedural.

These activities will be differentiated accordingly.

French

Children will also be developing skills in French this term. The topics that will be covered are:

Across the Curriculum
