

S5/6 Prelims – January 2024

Good afternoon,

Our S5/6 prelim diet begins on **Monday 8th January 2024**. I have attached a finalised copy of the timetable over the page. The purpose of the prelim diet is to provide an idea of progress being made by young people in their National Qualification courses. Staff will provide detailed feedback to young people in order to support improvements as we head towards the final SQA exams in Spring.

All young people who have additional support arrangements in place will receive a personalised timetable with the specific details, timings and venue of their exam and arrangements. This will be issued prior to the Christmas holidays. All other young people will receive a personalised exam timetable prior to the Christmas holidays, outlining exam timings and venue. Young people will also be given a seat number for each exam, similar to the final exam diet. This is also published each day outside the Assembly Hall. This is used to capture pupil attendance. It is important that your young person is aware of all details relating to each exam they are sitting.

The following exams will not feature on individualised timetables, but are going ahead as part of our prelim diet. Details are contained within the timetable over the page.

- Higher Sociology
- Higher Admin & IT Assignment

Where there is a clash in prelims, this will be communicated separately with specific young people, where alternative arrangements will be made for one of the prelim exams impacted. This is currently being worked on and any young person affected will be spoken to prior to the Christmas break.

Any S5/6 young person not involved in a prelim exam should be in their timetabled class accessing learning. Young people who have finished an exam should return to class as soon as their prelim has ended. A small number of prelims impact on lunch timings, these are detailed below:

- Sociology (National 5)
- Graphic Communication (National 5/Higher)
- Business Management (National 5)
- Admin & IT (National 5)
- Engineering Science (Higher)
- Human Biology (Higher)
- Drama (Higher)
- Art & Design (N5/Higher)
- Psychology (Higher)

Young people who are sitting the above prelims will be given time to have lunch from 12:30 on that day. I would advise that, for those sitting these prelims, they plan in advance regarding lunch. A limited selection of lunch options will be available in the school dining hall on these days as an early service.

Young people are not permitted to bring anything into the exam hall. Exam specific equipment will be permitted at desks (pens, calculators etc), and only water is allowed as a drink. All mobile phones etc should be switched off and left in bags at the back of the assembly hall.

Prelims are a crucial part of our evidence gathering on young people and it is important that your young person attends all prelim exams. Any young person who misses a prelim will be scheduled by faculties for catch-up. Please ensure that your young person is well prepared in advance of each prelim to ensure that they can perform to their maximum capacity. Please also encourage your young person to make the most of the time allocated within their exam.

Following our prelim diet, we will share a certificate with you outlining your young person's performance across all prelims. This will aid support post prelim on the lead up to final exams.
