'Live' Lesson Guidance for Pupils

In order for staff to further support pupils with their online learning there will be an option for classes to participate in 'live' lessons. A live lesson is where the teacher and pupil are 'present' at the same time, online and/or face-to-face. The advantages of this are there can be opportunities for real-time feedback and interaction with other pupils in the class. It can also provide staff with a valuable opportunity to check-in with pupils.

A 'live' lesson could be:

- A teacher being online at the same time as a pupil/class to deliver all or part of a lesson using 1-way live video and audio
- A teacher being online at the same time as a learner to deliver all or part of a lesson using 2-way live video and audio
- A teacher being online at the same time as a learner to answer questions or give feedback by either posting on the class team or communicating via glow email

A timetable of when staff will be available online will be published each Monday morning. You should use your school timetable to check if your teacher will be 'live' at a time when you would normally have the class. If you and your parent/carer have given consent for 'live' lessons/online tutorials it is important to remember the following points when you are online:

- 1. Always be responsible and respectful.
- 2. Ensure that you log on from a public space in your home eg. living room or kitchen do not take part in remote teaching from your bedroom.
- 3. Make sure your microphone is on mute when you join a meeting.
- 4. Use the chat function if you wish to type a question. The text chat facility is not for off-topic discussion any inappropriate comments made can be traced back to individual users.
- 5. Raise your hand if you wish to take your microphone off mute and then speak.
- 6. If there is an issue on the call regarding inappropriate behaviour, your teacher will end the lesson for you and a follow up call will be made.
