Thank you to everyone for signing up to SeeSaw. You will notice some differences to the free version last year. One significant difference is that you only have one app for the product rather than two (parent/carer and child). You simply log between both if using the same device. You can also access SeeSaw via the website, it is not purely an app platform. SeeSaw will share learning in school, provide photos, voice notes and share home learning tasks.
