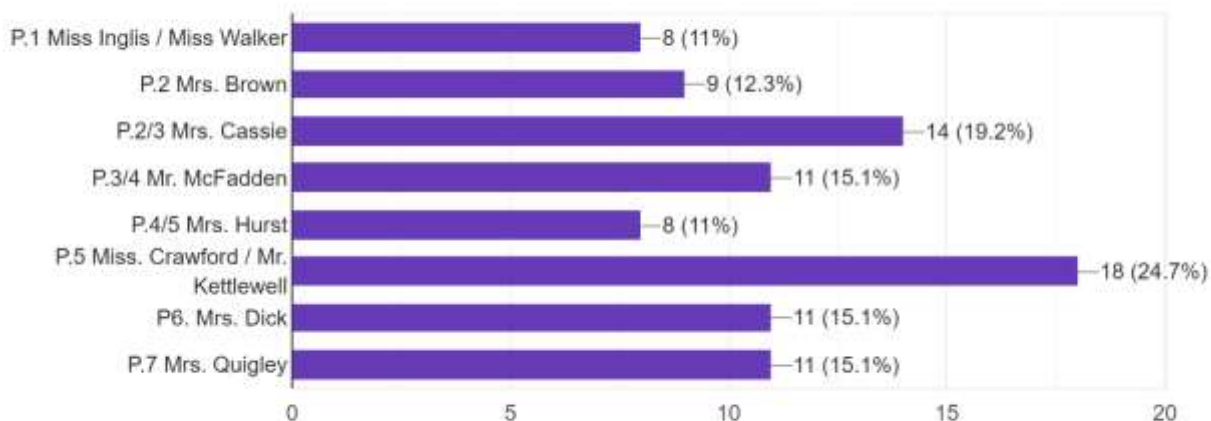

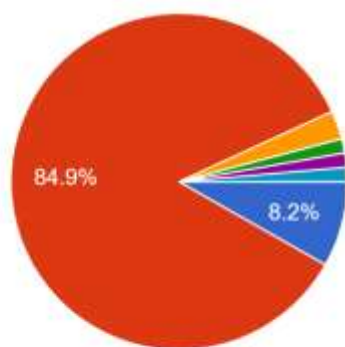
1. Which Class is your child/children in (tick all that apply)

2. Work set - Has the classwork that has been set been

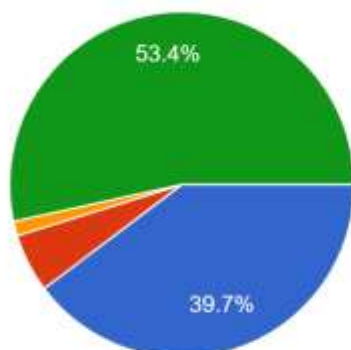

3. What is the best form of learning for your child?

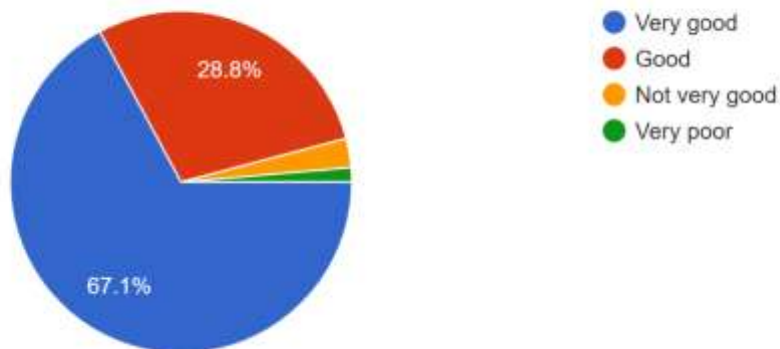

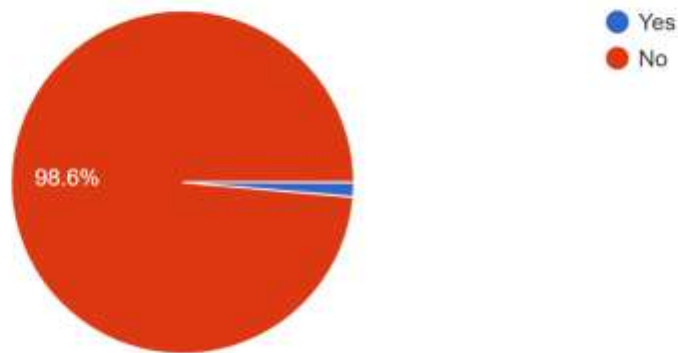
5. What can staff at RSMP do better? (Add any comments below to help us improve your child's learning experience) 29 responses
