<p>StudyLadder games</p> <p>Practise your addition and subtraction facts with your bigger numbers For example</p> <p>300+400=700 400+300=700 700-300=400 700-400=300</p> <p>BIG MATHS</p> <p>Log onto bigmaths.com (Instructions are on the glow group Gp-Primary 3)</p> <p>Big Maths challenges- can you beat your last score? Remember to predict what your story might be about and afterwards summarise the story (written or telling someone) in your own words. See Google classrooms every Wednesday</p> <p>Play 'Name Game' Pick a category eg animals, countries, cities, TV shows, songs or actual names. For example, if the category is animal, the first player might say pig. The next person must name another animal starting with the last letter of the previous animal. In this case "G" is the last letter in pig, so the second person might say gorilla.
