

### Numeracy

- Find some 2D shapes around your home – triangle, square, rectangle and circle.
- Practise counting out different amounts of objects, i.e. toys, pennies, etc.
- Make your own number line from 0-20.

### Literacy

- Read stories with your child and ask them to retell them in their own words.
- Practise writing your full name.
- Make up a story of your own. Ask an adult to help you write it down. Illustrate your story.
- Play 'I Spy' with your grown-up.
- Rainbow write the alphabet.

### Health and Wellbeing

- Try out Yoga using 'Cosmic Kids' on YouTube.
- Use the 'Jump Start Jonny' website to keep you active.
- Look in a mirror and discuss your facial expression and talk about different feelings people can have. Draw a self-portrait of how you are feeling right now.

### Science

- Collect objects from around the home and with an adult, investigate which ones will float or sink.
- Find out what plants need to help them grow. Plant something in a pot if you can.

Here are a range of curricular activities that your child could do at home...

### RME

- Learn about different cultures through My World Kitchen.

- Think about how you can care for others and show this kindness e.g. make a card or help a grown-up to tidy up.

### Expressive Arts

- Try to make different 'musical' sounds using household items, such as pots and pans, etc.
- Choose a famous artist and try to recreate your own version of this – such as Steven Brown's 'McCoos'.
- Play a mime game with your family and see if they can guess what you are acting out.

### Technology

- Use a range of recyclable materials to create a junk model.
- Practise cutting out simple shapes or different types of lines using scissors.

### Social Studies

- Find out more about the jobs that workers do on a farm.
- With a grown-up, use a search engine like google to do some research on your favourite farm animal.
- Look at a map of Scotland and find the place where you live. Point out any other towns or cities that you have been to.

## Primary 1 Home Learning



Here is some information on what we have recently been covering in class this term...

### **Literacy**

- All sounds in the alphabet a-z, plus joined phonemes **ck** and **qu**. All sounds and actions are in the purple sounds book that we send home.
- All common words covered so far are in the common words pocket that we send home.
- We have been blending simple CVC words, using the sounds we have learned so far – for example c-a-t makes 'cat'. For an extra challenge, you could make longer words such as s-t-a-n-d, p-a-r-t-s, etc.
- We have been reading a selection of stories and asking the children comprehension questions about what they have read – i.e. 'Who was the main character?' 'What do you think will happen next?' etc.

### **Numeracy**

- Numbers 0-20 – counting, ordering, writing. For an extra challenge, you could extend this up to 30.
- Half past times on analogue clocks. Previously we looked at o'clock timings on analogue and digital clocks.
- 2D shapes – square, circle, rectangle, triangle, oval. For a challenge, you could look at a wider range – e.g. pentagon, hexagon, octagon, kite, etc. We have talked about shape properties – i.e. corners, sides, etc.
- Pattern – continuing a simple shape pattern or creating one on your own.
- Halving shapes into two equal parts.
- Addition to 20. For an extra challenge, you could extend to adding within 30.

### **Please note...**

Any of the tasks detailed on the Literacy and Numeracy grids inside the yellow homework jotters can also be used for home learning activities.

### **Social Studies**

Our topic this term is 'The Farm'. We have been learning about the animals that live on a farm. The children could carry out further research on this and also, investigate farm jobs.
