Online enrolment for P1s starting in August 2024



Please let anyone you know who has a child due to start P1 in August 2024 that they must enrol their child online this week. The following information from SLC gives more details:

Children normally start school in August if their 5th birthday falls before 1 March of the following year.

If your child is due to start school in August 2024, you can enrol online from Monday 8 January 2024. Your catchment school will contact you between Monday 15 to Friday 19 January 2024 to confirm your enrolment.

To register your child for school you should complete our online registration form. You must identify the catchment school for your permanent home address by using the <u>school catchment checker</u>. This will give you information on both primary and secondary schools. The link to the online form will be given when you select your catchment school. It is only the parent the child ordinarily stays with who is authorised to register them. This includes the guardian or any person who is liable to maintain or has parental responsibilities. For more information see the <u>Children</u> (Scotland) Act 1995). If you have any difficul-

The online registration form will ask you to provide each child's full birth certificate and two pieces of recent official documentation both containing your permanent home address for example a utility bill, council tax statement, housing rent card, child benefit documentation. Proof of where the child lives may also be needed. Please note that a registration is required for each child (e.g. twins require a registration each).

Winter Weather

With there always being the possibility of some difficult weather conditions at this time of year, it may be worth reminding yourselves and the children of arrangements for when there is dangerous ice or snow.

We will attempt to ensure there is at least one route cleared from the street to the school in the event of heavy snow or ice. This will be the walkway beside the car park gate. A path will be cleared from there to the front entrance and nursery. A path will also be cleared round the right hand side of the school building to the first entrance to the lunch hall. School pupils will come in to the lunch hall and be collected by their class teachers there. If we are able to clear the other walkway beside the MUGA we will do so. We would try to ensure it



was cleared by the end of the day. However, if the poor weather were to persist that day, our priority would be to ensure the first route is safe, and children may be dismissed from the gym hall at the end of the day.

Only in extreme circumstances would the school be closed to pupils. The council's website, the school website, our Twitter feed and the school app would be the best place to look if you were concerned about this. These would be updated as quickly as possible. With a little under 400 children in the school and nursery,



the phone lines can be extremely busy at such times, so checking online as outlined above would be your best option. In the event of road condition's affecting the journey to school of some staff, we may hold back opening until 10.00 a.m. However, we are hopeful that it won't come to this and that we will be open as usual throughout the whole winter period.
