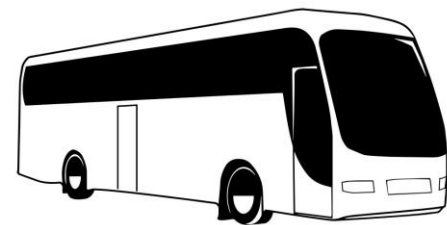

Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood Education

Like in all Scottish schools, Relationships, Sexual Health and Parenthood Education forms part of our Health and Wellbeing curriculum. Over the coming weeks, your child will be looking at age-appropriate aspects of this during class lessons. From P1 to P5 the children are looking at areas of feelings, relationships, caring, respect, self-awareness and personal safety. In P6 and P7 aspects of sexual health are also looked at. Further information about these lessons can be found on the [SSHPE.scot](https://www.sshp.scot.nhs.uk/) website.

In Primary 7, we will look at the following areas in the coming weeks:

- Describe human conception and birth, for example, sexual intercourse, egg and sperm, giving birth.
- Know the names for parts of their body required to understand conception, pregnancy and birth.
- Understand where living things come from.
- Understand the reasons why contraception may be used.
- A fair and equal life for girls and boys.

Some of the language introduced in these lessons may include:

Sex, penis, vagina, testicles, nipples, vulva, gay, lesbian, erection, orgasm, ejaculation, contraception, condoms, sexually transmitted infections, transgender, transgender men, transgender women and transphobia.

We will always deliver these important lessons with care and sensitivity. Your child may (or may not) wish to discuss what they have learned with you/parents at home. Please speak with them about it to reinforce positive messages if they wish to do so.

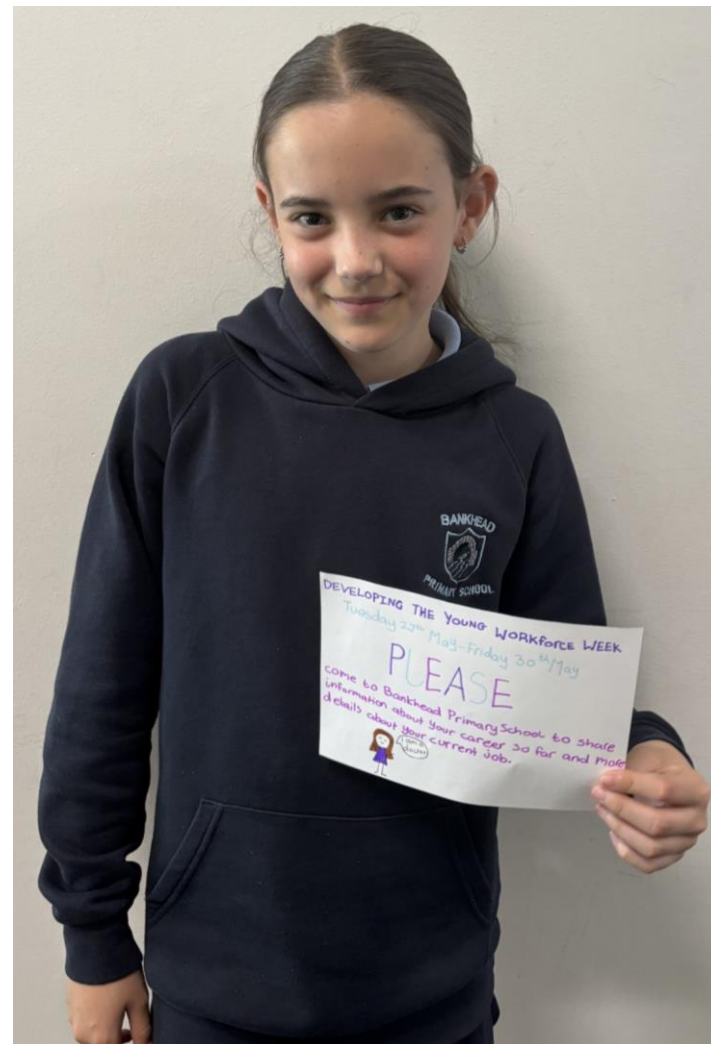

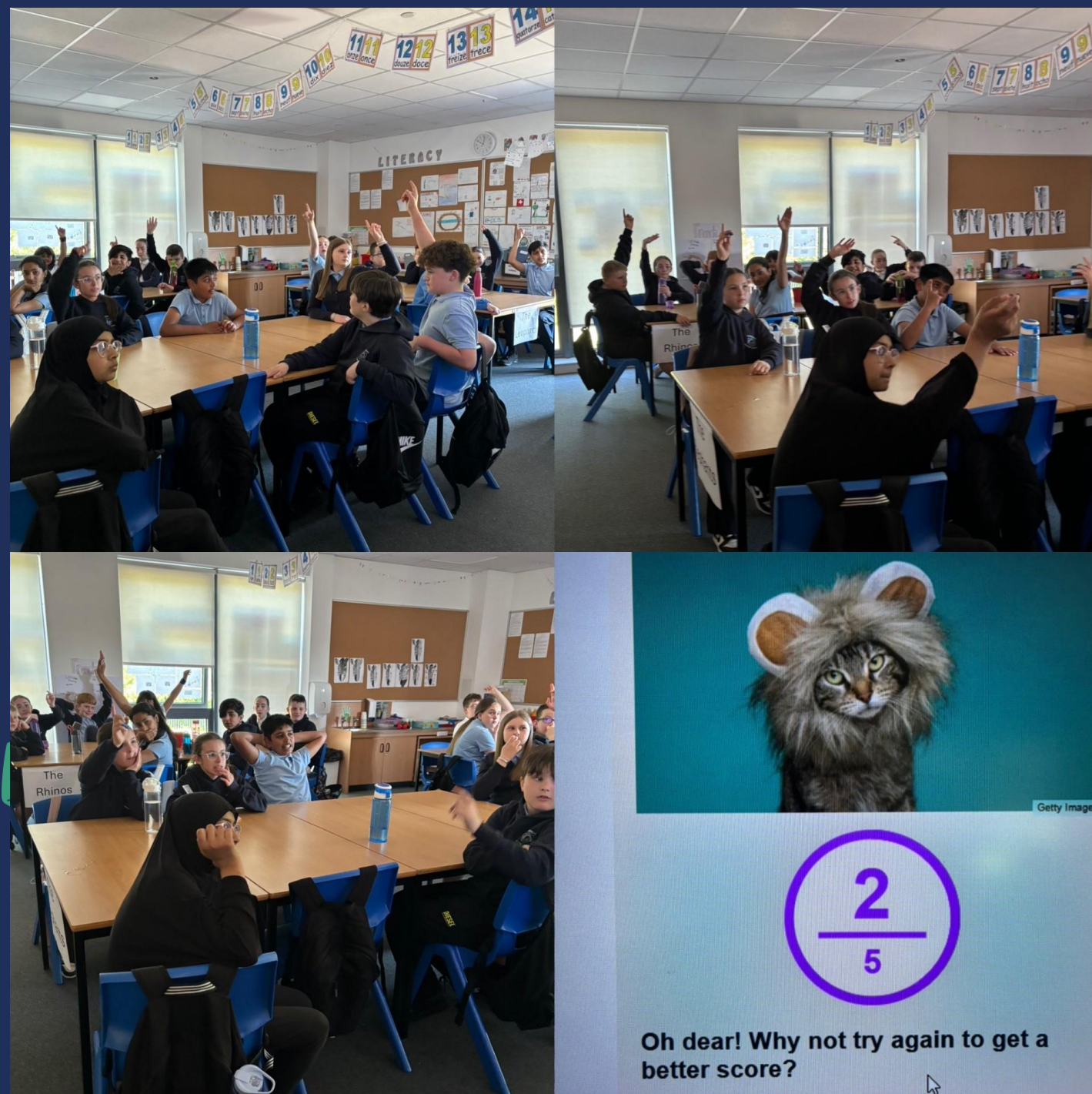
