Here are a range of suggested activities you could do at home with your child.

Maths

- Studyladder games
- Practise your times tables (2x 3x 4x 5x 10x) the Sumdog times tables games, Top Marks or making your own cards each with a number from 1-12 written on them. Mix them up then turn them over one at a time and test yourself.
- Practise counting the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. You can remind yourself of the terms faces (sides), edges and vertices (corners) with a BBC Bitesize video called 'what are the properties of 3D shapes' (I will put a hyper link on Google Classrooms),
- Have a go at making patterns using 2D tiling (tessellation). You can remind yourself what this is by watching the BBC Bitesize video 'What is tessellation' (I will put the hyperlink on Google Classrooms)
- Practise your bonds of 10. How can you show that you know these? (a picture or a diagram?)
- Logon to easimaths (via glow), and complete 15 minute session as often as you can.

Literacy

- Log onto Oxford Own via glow or google. Our class logon details are: Username: room 5 19-20 Password: 1234ICT
- Search for your groups book (see below). Remember to predict what your story might be about and afterwards summarise the story (written or telling someone) in your own words. You can also play the activities linked to your book (see the 'buttons' above the book)

- Watch BBC Newsround and discuss the topical issues - https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/news/watch_newsround
- Practise writing sentences with interesting describing words (adjectives). Help for this can be found on the BBC Bitesize clip 'Using Descriptive words' from 22nd April.
- On the work set by me on Study ladder you should find a short story to read and have a go at answering the questions.

Health and Wellbeing

- Joe Wickes workout (You tube)
- Create a game of skittles with empty (plastic) bottles. How many strikes can you get?
- Practice throwing a ball or beanbag to land within a target. If you are finding that too easy- try standing further away. If you're inside, practise throwing a scrunched up paper ball in to a mug or cup.
- Play Kim's game. Put a selection of objects on a tray then cover them up. Ask someone to remove one item. Can you work out which one has gone?
- Try 2 Mr Catman challenges on Go Noodle.

Other Curricular Areas

- ICT- Complete this weeks Kodable challenge No. 4- loops) You can find access to this on our group email. Log onto Glow and scroll down the left hand side until you find our class email called Grp- Primary 3
- Expressive arts: Make a musical instrument and play a tune. Can anyone work out what song you are playing? Tip- elastic bands and a tissue box or similar make a simple guitar, upside down saucepans make drums etc
- Technologies: Practise using a grater to grate cheese.
