Children's Learning is Understood Developmentally

'Adults understand how we change and grow'

Suggested activities:

- ❖ Talk to a member of your household about your favourite thing to learn/your favourite subject - describe why you enjoy this.
- ❖ Draw a picture of you in your house or outside learning something new.
- ❖ Write a senses poem about your senses when you are learning:
I see... I hear... I feel... I smell... I taste...
- ❖ Create a poster about all of the things you like to learn and the ways you like to learn (e.g. listening to someone, writing notes, role-play, reading, watching something, talking to someone etc.)
- ❖ Write an email/message on Google Classrooms to your teacher or Miss Boyd, explaining your favourite thing you have learned (a new skill maybe). Describe what you have learned and how you learned this.
- ❖ Teach someone at home how to do something new. How will you help them learn? Will you draw a diagram, do a demonstration, make a video or do something else?
